



# 4 Andongdam Certification Center — Geomamgyo


Distance: 15km / Estimated time: 60 minutes

Nakdonggang's bicycle path is the longest among the paths on Korea's four major rivers, so this itinerary takes a lot of time and physical endurance. Most travelers start from Andongdam or Sangpunggyo (Bridge) in Sangju. From Andongdam, the distance is 389km while it is 324km from Sangpunggyo, so it takes 3~4 days of steady pedaling to complete the course. Andongdam can be approached from Andong Intercity Bus Terminal or Andong Station. The distance from Andong Station is 3km less than from the bus terminal.

Nakdonggang's bicycle path, which began from Andongdam's Bicycle Path Certification Center, has several uphills from the beginning. It is also difficult to find supermarkets or convenience stores. It may be a good idea to prepare water and some snacks before you start.

Geomamgyo—Byeongsan-ri Hall for Seniors
Distance: 15km / Estimated time: 60 minutes
After leaving Geomamgyo (Bridge) and going up and down several hills, you'll find Danhogyo (Bridge). From there, you can visit Maaesolsup Park. If you have time, have a visit and rest under the shade of the great pine trees. Once you cross Danhogyo, you'll find another small bridge, and the bicycle path will break away from the river and lead into the village.






# Andong Hahoe Village

Hahoe Village is home to descendants of the Ryu clan of Pungsan and is wellknown for its traditional houses. The village became even more famous after Queen Elizabeth of England visited on April 21, 1999. The village is located at the foothills of Hwasan Mountain, an offshoot of Taebaek Mountain that rises up to the east. The center of the village is populated by large tile-roofed houses belonging to the Ryu clan, adding their own unique charm to the surrounding thatched roofs. Hahoe Village boasts exquisite scenic sights: the elegant Nakdonggang flowing around the village, the magnificent Buyongdae, endlessly unfolding sandy beaches, and lush, ancient pine trees.

### Samgang Tavern



The Nakdonggang bicycle path that started at Andongdam joins Saejae bicycle path at Sangpunggyo (Bridge) in Sangju and becomes the National Bicycle Path for Nakdonggang. The bicycle path certification center is located in Sangpunggyo, so make sure you get a certification stamp. The center is near Sabeol-myeon, Sangjusi, which is just across Yecheon-gun. Nakdonggang gets wider as it reaches Sangju, and really looks magnificent.








# Sangju, the City of Bicycles

Sangju is known as the city of bicycles. The entire city consists of fairly flat terrain, so it's easy to travel around on a bike. The City Hall and the District Office even lend out bicycles for free. With 104,000 residents, there are 85,000 bicycles, which means there are 2 for each household.







# Gyeongcheondae— Nakdanbo Certification Center

Distance: 22km / Estimated time: 90 minutes

Gyeongcheondae (Cliff) offers some of the most beautiful
scenery found on Nakdonggang. If you ride along the path,
you can reach Sangjubo (Weir), the first weir for irrigation in
Nakdonggang. The path that connects Sangjubo (Weir) and
Nakdanbo (Weir) has Naksan's old paths, boat paths, ascending
paths and shelters, so you can really enjoy the ride.



# Gyeongcheondae

Located in Samdeok-ri, Sabeol-myeon, Sangju-si, the area was chosen as the best vantage point to grasp views of the Nakdonggang. The cliffs, wide sandy beach, and river shining in the sunlight are marvelous. As locals believe it is granted by god himself, it is also called "Jacheondae." The pine tree rooted on the cliff side facing the Nakdonggang as well as the crane shaped Cheonjubong (Peak) is especially memorable.



### Nakdanbo Certification Center - Ilseongyo

Distance: 17km / Estimated time: 70 minutes

The Nakdanbo (Weir), the second weir for irrigation of Nakdonggang, is located in the former site of Nakdongnaru (Port). The name 'Nakdan' came from Nakdongmyeon, Sangju-si's 'Nak' and Danmil-myeon, Uiseong-gun's 'Dan'. Get a stamp from Nakdanbo Certification Center, and then continue riding along the path. The open landscape of Nakdonggang and the peaceful scenery of Uiseong-gun will grab your attention and help you get over your exhaustion.





## **Uiseong-gun**

Uiseong, the place you will slide by, is a small city famous for garlic and cornelian cherries. The city is well-known for local specialties such as garlic beef, garlic pork and garlic ham, all of which are made from animals that were fed garlic. The garlic chicken cooked with raw garlic is a special delicacy that you can enjoy only at Uiseong. The cornelian cherries, another symbol of Uiseong, reach full blossom at the end of March and early April every year. The cornelian cherry festival is held during this period, and attracts many tourists.










### 8 9 Ilseongyo – Gumi Youth Training Center

Distance: 10km / Estimated time: 40 minutes

The bicycle path along Nakdonggang (River) leads to Haepyeong Wetland, occupying a vast area of about 132,000m<sup>2</sup> in Haepyeong-myeon, Gumi-si, Gyeongsangbuk-do. The wetland, filled with Korean king willows and reeds, is also home to numerous migratory birds traveling from Russia to Japan during the winter. Gumibo Certification Center, located around the Haepyeong Wetland, serves as a stop for travelers, from which bicycle path further stretches along National Road No. 25.





## **Gumi Haepyeong Market**

A regular market was established from the early 1920s. In the 1960s and 1970s, when Gumi Haepyeong Market was prosperous, a cattle market flourished and about 200 to 300 bulls and cows were traded each day. Gumi Haepyeong Market, which still exists as a traditional market, opens every 5 days, on the 4th, 9th, 14th, 19th, 24th and 29th of every month. The market opens early in the morning and closes around 3 pm, and not only features Haepyeong Clean Rice (or Geumosan Clean Rice), which is renowned for its cleanness, but also includes a wide range of seasonal agricultural products such as watermelons, oriental melons, peanuts, peppers and garlic that are cultivated in the fertile land and clean environment near Nakdonggang, as well as a variety of household items. 149-4, Nakseong-ri, Haepyeong-myeon, Gumi-si, Gyeongsangbuk-do 054-480-6612, 054-474-4205







### 9 10 Gumi Youth Training Center - Namgumidaegyo

Distance: 16km / Estimated time: 60 minutes

The 3.6 kilometer-long bicycle path which starts from the Kumho National Institute of Technology (KIT) offers bicyclists the feeling exhilarating speed as they ride at the foot of the cliff. The precipitous cliff and meandering Nakdonggang also offer an enthralling bike ride. The bicycle path, passing through Sanhodaegyo (Bridge) and downtown Gumi, leads riders to Gumidaegyo (Bridge) without causing tiring them at all.









## Gumi, the equivalent of Silicon Valley

Gumi is home to manufacturing facilities for semiconductors, cell phones, LCD, and other high-tech electronic and IT products. Naturally, city has been called the Korean equivalent of Silicon Valley. The Gumi Industrial Complex is occupied by about 2,000 businesses which employ a total of 8,000 skilled workers. The KIT features the Gumi Ubiquitous Experience Hall to represent Gumi so that visitors can learn about the lifestyle of Gumi citizens.


### Waegwan Market

Waegwan Market first opened in 1981, and is close to many historic sites and local specialties. It is a permanent market and opens every 5 days. Notably, the market is so well known for selling a variety of products that customers living in adjacent cities such as Daegu and Gumi frequently make the trip. Boyang-tang, roast beef and rice soup with Sundae (boiled or steamed cow or pig intestines) are the market's delicacies, and they are also suitable as a meal.

### 2nd Waegwangyo — Seongjudaegyo

Distance: 15km / Estimated Time: 60 minutes

If you keep pedaling your bicycle, leaving behind the Old Waegwan Railroad Bridge, you will soon find the City of Daegu. The bicycle path continues to run along the river, allowing you to feel the breeze. If you want to see Korea traditional house, it is recommondable to go Samgaheon. A traditional house built during the Joseon Dynasty and located around Nakdonggang.









### Samgaheon

Samgaheon is a traditional house built during the Joseon Dynasty, located in Myori, Habin-myeon, Dalseong-gun, Daegu-si. It was originally built as a straw-roofed house in 1769, to which Anchae and Sarangchae (which mean main house and guest house, respectively) were added in 1809 and 1827. In 1874, Numaru was additionally built in Byeoldang (or detached house). Samga (or three abilities) refers to the ability to properly rule the world and the country, to reject recommended government positions and reward, and to willingly act as a righteous and resolute individual.

Distance: 19km / Estimated time: 80 minutes

The bicycle path, which runs along the peripheral areas of Daegu, leads to the Dalseong Wetland. As the Dalseong Wetland path off from the road, Gangjeonggoryeongbo (Weir) appears, featuring a bicycle path certification center. Gangjeonggoyeongbo is the largest of the 16 dams built around the country. The bicycle path then leads to Goryeong-gun, Samunjingyo (Bridge), and Daegu.




# Daegu Modern Alley

Tourists can go on a trip back through time in Daegu, starting at Dongsan Foreign Missionary's House and Cheongra Hill, called "Montmartre of Daegu". 

### 3 0kpo Ecological Park-Pakseokjingyo

Distance: 18km / Estimated time: 70 minutes

The bicycle path then leads to Okpo-myeon, Nongong-eup, and finally Dalseongbo (Weir). Dalseongbo gives visitors the feeling of a relaxing cruise about to begin. It harbors a bicycle path certification center, where bicycles are rented. Where Dalseongbo path off, the road extends to the boundary between Dalseong-gun and Goyroeng-gun. If you keep pedaling for 4 more kilometers, you will reach Pakseokjingyo (Bridge) via Goryeong-gun.










# Goryeong, capital of Great Gaya

Goryeong, which used to be the capital of Great Gaya, thrived until the 6th century. The Jisan-dong Tombs contains about 700 tombs and the country's first No.44 and 45 sacrificial burial sites. Treasure No. 138 Gaya Golden Crown, earthen wares, wooden lacquer wares, and artifacts of the Great Gaya Period were excavated from the No. 44 burial site. The 2 kilometer-long path which runs along the tomb site may cause you to feel the ambience of Great Gaya, which thrived about 1,500 years ago.












### Dodongseowon

Dodongseowon (Lecture Hall) was built to commemorate the ethical theology and admirable acts of Kim Goeng-pil (1454-1504), a scholar of Joseon Dynasty (whose pen name was Han Hweon Dang). It originally was built in Ssanggye-dong, which stood at the foot of Biseulsan (Mt.) in Hyeonpung in 1568 (during the 1st year of King Seonjo's reign). It was burned to the ground during the invasion by the Japanese army in 1597. In 1605 (the 38th year of King Seonjo's reign), it was re-built as Borodongseowon (Lecture Hall) and was officially entitled "Dodongseowon" later. 3 726, Gujiseoro, Guji-myeon, Dalseong-gun, Daegu-si 053-617-7620



# Hyeonpung Seokbinggo

Hyeonpung Seokbinggo is an icehouse made of stone constructed in the Joseon Dynasty, and ice stored in it was collected from the deep valley when the water is frozen in the winter season. There were several stone icehouses, in which ice didn't melt even in the summer season, located not only in Hyeonpung but Gyeongju, Andong and Changnyeong. Hyeonpung Seokbinggo is estimated to have been built in the 1730s, and people can feel the cold breeze coming out of the icehouse when they stand in front, even in the hot summer.




### Pakseokjingyo - Yinojeong

Distance: 20km / Estimated time: 80 minutes

Hyeonpung is home to a mountain pass called "Daramjae". It may be difficult to reach the peak, which commands a good view of Nakdonggang. It also features Dodongseowon (Lecture Hall), a traditional work of architecture built more than 400 years ago. The lecture hall served as a place for teaching students and to hold memorials to commemorate the Joseon Dynasty's great teachers.





### **Upo Wetland**

Upo Wetland occupies an area of 2,310,000m2 that covers Jumae-ri, Changnyeong-gun and An-ri, Ibangmyeon, Daedae-ri, Yueo-myeon, and Sejin-ri. The wetland is filled with numerous water plants. The trees partially submerged in the swamp create a primitive ambience. Upo Wetland was registered in the Ramsar List of Wetlands in March 1988. The Ramsar Convention on Wetlands has designated a wetland which deserves to be conserved as a natural habitat of threatened and endangered species of wild animals and plants. ### **Alternative Route 1021**

After passing through Bakjingyo (Bridge), Chilhyeon-ri and Namji-eup, Changnyeonggun, the bike route joins Route 1021. A traveler who needs to pass this section has to choose whether to use the bike route that goes along the river or ride on the Route 1021. Route 1021 is recommended for beginners on their first bike trip. As the bike route going along the river requires crossing a mountain, which means there are lots of uphill paths, it would be hard for a beginner. If you are a cyclist that is willing to test your physical limits, try the standard bike route. Otherwise, it would be better to use Route 1021.






Distance: 26km

Estimated time: 90 minutes

When the bicycle path running along Nakdonggang Levee nears an end, Bakjingogae (Ridge) comes into sight. The ridge is 2km long and tilts at a 13 degree angle. The mountain course is so rough that it can feel that you are actually carrying your bicycle over your shoulder. Once you reach the peak, however, you can enjoy a panoramic view of Nakdonggang. Going down the hill is also a very enjoyable ride.









### Namjigyo – Changnyeonghamanbo Certification Center

Distance: 10km / Estimated time: 40 minutes

If you keep pedaling from Namjigyo (Bridge), then you will find Changnyeonghamanbo (Weir), located in the southernmost area of Nakdonggang. From this point on, Nakdonggang grows wider like a river.





### Changnyeonghamanbo Certification Center—Susandaegyo

Distance: 20km / Estimated time: 70 minutes

When you ride past Changpyeonghamanbo (Weir), located southernmost among the eight dams around Nakdonggang, Yimhaejin (Port) comes into sight. The port called Yimhaejin was formed as a result of the sea water flowing 40km in reversing Nakdonggang. The bicycle path reaches Bonpogyo (Bridge) from the Yimhaejin intersection, but it is interrupted from place to place. It is usually better to take Local Road No. 1022. The local road has a relatively small traffic load, but it would be better not to ride too fast for safety reasons. Once you ride past Bonpogyo connecting Changnyeong-gun and Changwon-si, Bonpo Waterside Ecological Park will come into sight. From this point on, Bangjuk-gil goes straightforward. If you enter the path to the village in Changwon, you will soon find encounter Susandaegyo (Bridge).









### **Junam Wetland**

This is a wetland that is a habitat for approximately 150 kinds of birds, including about 50 kinds of migratory birds that have been designated as endangered species by the Ministry of Environment and about 20 kinds of natural monuments including spectacled teal, white-naped crane and spoonbill. 



Estimated time: 60 minutes When you go straight instead of crossing Susandaegyo (Bridge), you will find an endless riverside road. Road No. 638 leads to the hillside road on the left side. Climbing the road will be tough, but when you reach the peak, you will be able to enjoy the panoramic view of Nakdonggang and Miryanggang (River). When you go down the hill, you will also be able to enjoy a fast and thrilling ride. When the hill fades away, you will find a village and Nakdonggang Indogyo (Bridge). It also is known because of the film title, "Bridge on the River Kwai", because this bridge has a similar appearance and story as the one in the film. If you cross the bridge and turn right, then Samrangjingyo (Bridge) will come into sight.









### Samrangjingyo-Wondong Station

Distance: 12km / Estimated time: 50 minutes

When you start from Samryangjin Station and enter the bicycle path built along Nakdonggang's levee, you will find a small underground road leading to Jagwongwanji. In Jagwongwanji, government officials touring Miryang used to stay overnight or counter invasions by the Japanese army. The wooden-deck bicycle path along Nakdonggang at the foot of precipitous Cheontaesan (Mt.) runs parallel with Gyeongbu Railroad. While traveling there, you may feel a refreshing breeze. You may also appreciate Wolli Village, which is renowned for its Japanese apricots.




### Wolli Village

Wolli Village in Wondong-myeon, Gyeongsangnam-do, is renowned for its beautiful apricots. A number of photographers flock to the village to capture the scene of a train meandering against the backdrop of Nakdonggang filled with full-blown apricots. When spring comes and the apricot trees bloom, people carrying cameras wait on a hill to get a good view of a train as it moves past. The apricot festival is held in the village every year when the apricot trees bloom.

A wooden-deck bicycle path leads to Yangsan Water Culture Center, where you can take a break. A huge rock in Imgyeongdae called "Gyeongpadae" is seen around here, and it is engraved with a Chinese poem by Jeong Im-gyo of the Joseon Dynasty, who was inspired by this rock to write the poem. The bicycle path runs parallel with the railroad and fades away into Mulgeum Station. When you keep pedaling along the river, you will find Busan.







When you ride past Dongwon Station, you will find bicycle path that spreads wide along Nakdonggang levee. If you feel bored while riding along the river, it would be better to temporarily take a vehicle path on a hill. The path is lined with cherry trees on both sides. If you travel in the spring, then you may feel like you are riding a bicycle in a tunnel of flowers. The bicycle path overlooking Hwamyeong Station and Gupo Station will bring you closer to downtown Busan and finally to Hagutduk (Estuary Levee) around Nakdonggang.












### **Gupo Market**

Gupo Market is one of Korea's most famous traditional markets that open every 5 days, and is located at Deokcheon Intersection in Gupo-dong, Buk-gu, the City of Busan. Gupo Market opens on dates ending with 3 or 8, and it is heavily crowded on market day due to visitors coming from all over the country, which frequently causes traffic jams in the adjacent roads. Gupoguksu (noodles) are a must-eat food for people who visit Gupo Market. 



### Busan Sajik Baseball Park

Busan Sajik Baseball Park is a place where visitors can experience the passion and enthusiasm of Busan residents for baseball. It is a baseball park used as a home ground for Lotte Giants, and games are held every day except Monday during the professional baseball season from April to October. 

If you continue to go straight on the bicycle path that les below Nakdong Bridge, then you will find Eulsukdo featuring Hagutduk (Estuary Levee), a final destination of the bicycle path along Nakdonggang. Eulsukdo is home to about 100,000 kinds of winter migratory birds that may be categorized into 50 species. The 389km bicycle trip, which starts from Andongdam, ends at the Hagutduk Certification Center along Nakdonggang, where your trip is finalized as sealed. If you don't want to leave immediately, then it would be a good idea to tour Busan.







### Eulsukdo

A wealth of silts are accumulated at the mouth of Nakdonggang, which, to no surprise, is home to various migratory birds such as mallards, swans, white-tailed sea eagles, black-faced spoonbills, and storks. It was once the largest migratory bird habitat in Asia and was designated as Natural Monument No. 179 in 1966. As the entire island was redefined as park land, the ecological system started to collapse. In 2005, efforts were launched to restore the island and continued for five years. As a result, it was reformed into the Eulsukdo National Park for Migratory Birds. If you

wish to explore Eulsukdo, it would be better to start the trip from the eco center at the mouth of Nakdonggang. It provides information regarding ecology at the mouth of the wetland by showcasing various features. You can also closely watch migratory birds at the experience site that is a short distance away from the eco center at the mouth of Nakdonggang. It may take about 25 minutes to reach the experience site on foot. You can ride an electric bus to reach the site. 1151-14, Hadan-dong, Saha-gu, Busan-si (Nakdonggang Migratory Bird Sanctuary)

### Buyongdae

Buyongdae is a cliff about 64m high situated where the Taebaek Mountain Range ends. From the summit, one can get a bird's eye view of the Hahoe Village in Andong. The name was taken from an ancient history of China. Meaning lotus, the name Buyongdae is said to be given for Hahoe Village's configuration like a lotus flower. Thus, one can get the best view of the village from the cliff.


### Dalseong Wetland









### How to Use the Unattended Certification Centers

- 1 First, check that there is a stamp in the booth.
- 2 Then, stamp your passport on the corresponding page.
- 3 Just in case you need more evidence to prove that you were really there, take a photo in front of the booth!











### When riding on the road

- 1 If there is a right turn lane, shift to the other lane and pass through.
- 2 If one lane allows both a right turn and to go straight, ride on the left side of the right lane.
- 3 If you stay on the right side of the right lane, you may crash with a vehicle that is turning right.
- 4 If the lane is narrow, it is safer to ride on the center lane (A) rather than riding on the right side of the lane (B).
- 5 It is dangerous to ride moving in and out of the spaces between parked cars.
- 6 The directions that the dotted lines show are the drivers' usual direction of sight. Driving the wrong way in this case is dangerous because there is possibility for a head-on collision with the car taking a right turn.
- 7 Driver A may not see the bike rider due to vehicle B. Also, you must ride at least 1m away from vehicle B in case the driver door.


